Three years ago our school playground was given a life expectancy of only five years. Our parent council group then began the process of funding and deciding on a new playground.

During this time, Crozier Agencies were in town and made calls to some of the schools in Brandon promoting their company. As I was the President of the Parent Council, I met with Farley and he left me a catalogue and price list. As our expectations were high, we chose a playground and began fundraising towards this goal. Little did we know, this endeavor was going to be harder to reach than we had planned. Farley kept in touch with regular phone calls and gave different resources to try for funding. At the beginning of this year, we came to the realization that we were not going to be able to reach this goal before the deadline of demolition. In August, I contacted Farley again with another request. Our school's 50th Anniversary was being held on October 7 and 8th and we were wondering if the playground could be installed before this date.

He worked diligently and was able to accommodate our request installing our playground on September 29th, one week before our Anniversary.
